A Global Visioconference Network for Otolaryngology

The aim of LION is to create a permanent interactive worldwide high speed network for Continuing Education in Otolaryngology and to promote distance learning using modern videoconferencing technologies.



This advanced medical network technology provides the data communications infrastructure essential to the development of the global otolaryngological community.

The annual program will offer participants around the world direct and interactive access to international experts in the various fields of otolaryngology. The program is currently focused on Otolaryngology-Neurotology but it will grow in the future to include other fields of ENT. Such multicenter sessions will emulate the advantages of international meetings by allowing exchanges of idea and experiences. The LION project will provide a focus for training as well as an enhanced professional experience.
